Dr. IJ Singh

I.J. SINGH came to the United States in 1960 on a Murry & Leonie Guggenheim Foundation fellowship. He received a PhD in anatomical sciences from the University of Oregon Medical School (now Oregon Health Sciences University), and a DDS from Columbia University.

He is a professor of anatomical sciences at New York University, and served for many years as the coordinator of anatomical sciences at its College of Dentistry.

I. J. Singh serves on the editorial advisory board of the *Sikh Review* (Calcutta). He is a frequent speaker and writer on the Sikh experience in the diaspora and interfaith issues. He has lectured at Stanford, Rutgers, Columbia, New York, Boston, Trinity (San Antonio), and other universities, and delivered the 2004 University Lecture on Guru Nanak (the Founder of Sikhism) at San Jose State University. He has also lectured abroad in the United Kingdom, Singapore, Canada and India.

He currently serves on the Advisory Boards of the *Sikh Research Institute* (Texas), and the *United Sikhs*, and as a trustee of the *MBSK Foundation* (New York). Since 1994, he has continued to serve on the Editorial Advisory Board of the *Sikh Review* (Calcutta).
